社會資訊發展一日千里,我校也緊貼時代的步伐,訂立三年目標「優化深層思維,拓闊學習視野」,此目標已進入第二個年頭,我看到同學不論在學業,以至品行上都對自己有更高的要求,課內、課外拓闊學習視野之餘,也從多方面發掘學習的趣味。文集收錄不同年級同學的優秀文章,既抒發同學對學校、師長、同儕間的情誼,也走訪大街小巷,描寫學校與生活社區的所見所聞,以文字記錄這份珍貴的回憶,「一粒沙裡看世界,一朵花裡看天堂」,這份真摯的人情味躍然紙上,不無感受到真光同學最真摯、最重情的一面。

文字可以絲絲入扣,聲音可以觸動人心。文集再不是一本純文字的作品集,而且更是一本有聲書。校慶徵文比賽得獎作品除了收錄在文集之中,更邀請了得獎同學及不同級別的同學朗讀文章,透過聲音、畫面、文字記錄同學的回憶。

「世事洞明皆學問,人情練達即文章」,我在此寄語每一位真光同學,每一天都是成長的歷練,每種挑戰都是跨越障礙的力量,只要持守「真理之燈」,用心經營個人的品德修養,定會在世上普照出最耀眼的光芒。



Time flows by like a river when we witness today the 148th year of True Light schools since their establishment, celebrating the 45th Anniversary of Hong Kong True Light College. Since its foundation nearly half a century ago, our College has seen progress and changes over different eras. Written chronicles have developed from word-by-word, line-by-line transcription in the 70s to the speech-to-text applications commonly found in mobile devices nowadays. This anthology collects the outstanding essays from students of different levels. They chronicle the most precious memories on paper - some are sentimental recounts about the school, their teachers and peers; others journalistic depictions of their experience in the school and in the community. As quoted from William Blake, "to see a world in a grain of sand; and a heaven in a wild flower", their pieces are vividly alive with such candid affection, in which readers are touched by the most genuine and compassionate narration of our True Light girls.

Words weave worlds of wonders, while sounds stir sensations. This anthology is not only a collection of written pieces, but also an audio book. All the winning essays of the 45th Anniversary writing contest are collected in the anthology together with their recitals by the winners and students of different levels with a view to leaving students' memories by audio, visual and written recounts.

"Knowledge is to quest for all truths; writing excels when recounting virtues attained." This is the message I wish all True Light students take. Learn through experience every day, as every challenge empowers you to overcome your next hurdle. As long as you uphold the Lamp of Truth and strive for your character-building and cultivating virtues, your light will surely shine so brightly before the others.





從滿足感中尋得快樂,與此同時成就感亦會相應增加,皆因滿足即是 達到自身訂立的某些要求或標準,完成後當然會感到自豪,於是成就感便 會增加及上升。而成就感對個人成長來說是相當重要,自我認同藉成就感 建立,繼而提升自尊感,使得自己在人生旅途上覓得足夠自信,有信心作 出各種大膽且嶄新的嘗試及闖蕩,追求理想而快樂滿足的人生。





然而滿足並不代表要縱情聲色,這極其量能滿足個人的物慾,但心靈仍舊是虛空,縱使喝着烈酒,裹着狐裘,心坎卻時刻颳着暴風,寒冷一直流轉徹心的冰涼,也無法被暖意的幸福快樂充實。所謂的「靈魂的無紛擾」,我認為起碼人要無愧於心,勿幹違反社會道德、與良知背道而馳的事,否則你每天的生活只會被提心吊膽佔據,夜夜纏綿悱惻,更遑論得快樂了。不合乎道德良心的過錯使自己耿耿於懷,彷如一塊磐石牢牢壓在心頭,使得內心經常七上八下,又何以追尋快樂呢?

快樂之道

什麼是快樂?想必大部份人都會回答富有、擁有名利便是快樂。然而 真正的快樂是什麼?

有人認為快樂是滿足。心理學大師馬斯洛提出需求五階段論來解釋滿足的五種階段,包括生存、安全、富足、社會地位、自我實現。當人擁有以上的條件時,便會感到滿足快樂。但這種快樂是長久的嗎?人的慾望是無窮無盡的,即使有一刻慾望得到滿足,下一秒又會有新的要求,這種透過滿足慾望而獲得得快樂只是短暫的。

那怎樣才能得到永恆的快樂呢?

知足常樂。《佛遺教經》云:「知足之人,雖臥地上,猶為安樂; 不知足者,雖處天堂,亦不稱意。」人以追求財富為人生目標、快樂的源 頭。但人在追求富裕的物質生活時會產生許多煩惱和痛苦。而這些煩惱和 痛苦正正來自「不知足」。因為慾望不是單一的,不同的慾望可以同時存 在。正如人可以一方面追求名利,一方面追求健康,一方面追求自由,一 方面追求愛情,一方面追求心靈財富,永不知足、得不到快樂。因為當某 一方面不被滿足時,即使有一方面得到實現,人亦會感到失落。

春秋末期有一位著名的謀略家,越王勾踐的臣子——文種。他和范蠡一起為越王打敗吳王夫差立下赫赫功勞。滅吳後,他自覺功高,不聽從范蠡勸告繼續留下,不料越王聽信讒言,誤以為他要造反作亂,最終受賜劍自刎而死。文種選擇留下正因為不知足,盼留在越王身邊為臣以獲得更大的名利,卻只能悲劇收場。

常言道:「人生不如意十之八九」,又怎會事事得到滿足?人要是能

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知足,便能得到永恆的快樂。知足是珍惜現在所擁有的人、事、物,不浪費,無慾無念無求,不去追求太多額外的事物。若做到這個地步,煩惱和痛苦自解。也因為無憂無慮,所以感到安樂。

顏回是孔子最窮困的學生。孔子曾問顏回:「你又窮又沒有地位,為何不去考功名做官呢?」顏回說道:「我不顧意做官。我在城廓外有五十畝田地,已足夠我喝上稠米粥;在城廓裡還有十畝地,產的桑麻完全可以供給我衣服。平時彈琴自娛,從夫子您那裡學到的道理足可以使我自得其樂,所以我不想做官。」顏回安貧樂道,珍惜現在所擁有的,即使窮困亦遠比其他人活得快樂。

既然生活拮据的顏回都能因知足而快樂,香港人便更有條件了。

據香港統計處最新統計顯示,住戶每月入息中位數從2012年的20000元升至22000萬元。但香港人的快樂程度不斷下跌,根據聯合國2015年「世界快樂調查」,香港從2012年的第46位降至本年的第72位。這反映了即使港人的收入上升,他們仍感到不快樂。小孩無憂無慮、無壓力,本應是最快樂的人。但在香港,由於父母對小孩的期望過大,為他們安排過多課外活動和補習班,令他們承受巨大的壓力;成年人每日則要為生計打拼,擔心業務,同樣備受壓力;而老年人的快樂莫過於子孫的陪伴,但子女只顧事業,孫子孫女只顧學業,只剩下少許甚至沒有時間陪伴。在這種情況下,香港人又怎會快樂呢?

若香港人要快樂,最先決的是要由自己做起,學會知足,放鬆心情,享受現有的生活,正如理察·華格納所說:「快樂不在於事情,而在於我們自己。」

快樂目標

「聯合國二零一五年度世界快樂調查的結果日前於世界各地公佈……」沉靜的車廂裏傳來電台主持人平穩的聲音,平淡地敘述着世界正在發生的事。兩位看上去胖胖的主婦坐到我前排的座位,義正嚴詞地批評着通脹的影響,她們的聲音在這窄小的車廂中顯得格外突兀。「嘖!」我身旁坐着的乘客倒是被吵得不耐煩,拿起電話,看着螢幕上起伏的數字看得入了迷,手指靈巧地在智能電話的螢幕上舞動,臉都快要貼上去了。「香港人的快樂程度不斷下跌,由二零一二年的第四十六位降至本年度的第七十二位……」電台的聲音還在默默地傳播,車上的人都一臉麻木冷淡,我不禁想:香港人究竟快樂嗎?

近年,快樂成為了一個對個人,以至城市的成功指標。如果一個不快樂的人,源自於自身追求幸福的失敗;那麼,一個不快樂的城市,難道就不是因為政府的無能,令生活在城市的人感受不到快樂嗎?因此每個人,以至城市,都有一套快樂指標,綜合各方面的數據,把人們快樂的情緒量化,再轉化為數據,成為評量一個人或是一個政府成功與否的綜合指標,因而出現了如世界快樂報告,幸福生活指標等評估。

香港是一個繁榮的大都會,一切事物追求效率,令我們都把焦點放在未完成的目標上,令自己背負上沉重的壓力。假若香港人都能夠活在當下,就自己完成的過程中感到滿足和自豪,我相信,快樂自會留下。

車廂外,人來人往,人們低着頭急步走向目的地,何不慢下來,看看路邊,也許開滿了燦爛的花朵,讓我們用眼睛攝下最美麗的風景,刻劃出最亮麗的人生。

像是抹和揮之不去的陰影,一道道灰色交替,常人眼中的灰,在他眼簾下成為最上來的材料。眉心緊皺着,如擁抱自己的畫作般,細數角落的每處細節。他又指起另一枝毫筆,淺淺抹平所見,泛起的漣漪如同他的處境,他仔細思考,冷不防在畫面的正中央,加上一劃刺眼的紅。

在最扣人心弦的瞬間,他卻戛然而止,冷冷掉下一句。「完成了。」

篤定堅信著自己已完成作品而稍帶不耐煩的臉仍舊緊皺著眉,再次敲了敲我的桌子。我愣了愣,才伸手接過,語氣中盡是無可奈何的嘆息:「我早說過,不該再把平常習慣的風格代入應試模式中,您會損失去多分數……喂!先把我的話聽完!」

他對我的話充耳不聞,徑直走出畫室。而我無奈地握著手中顏料半乾 的書作,邊苦惱著如何勸說這位堅持已見又執著的學生。

他的作品中流露著對現實的不滿,我也曾經歷過他所經歷的,自然能理解當中的不滿和委屈。

灰色向來是繪畫時忌用的色彩,往主體一抹,技術不純熟的,色彩頓時顯得生硬;往背景一劃,空間被抹殺,構圖顯得平板……然而在真正懂得享受藝術的人眼中灰是組成萬物的基本;亦是分析色彩的調子,支撐起整個畫面。所以,灰也成為一部分人心中的獨龍,而我面前的畫作,亦是當中的一份子。

他在作品中,加入了一抹刺眼的紅,那是刻意的,故意在焦點的正中央,所有人注目的部分,隨性又故意的一筆粗糙的紅,甚至不經修飾,能清晰看到筆尖的輪廓。





「他要是在固執下去,只能給他打個不合格的分數了,再怎樣說,教育制度下所需要的藝術創作並不是這些。」「完全沒有色彩的運用,儘管再怎樣有技巧,亦不可能給予過高的分數呢。」和同樣是任教藝術科的導師討論道,卻不由得再次為他擔憂起來——應試所需要的作品和藝術創作不同,亦毋需灌注感情,只需將你所擁有的全數展現於人前;這樣的應試模式,顯然引起他的強烈反感。那抹紅色,仿如無聲的反抗,拒絕接納茶毒的制度。

「畫圖時要注意空間感,又有色彩的變化,同時也要豐富畫面的細節,構圖要生動……」千篇一律的叮囑喃喃道,猶如念著經文般的重覆著,重覆著,只希望學生能牢記於心。

站在講台上的我,留意著每個學生的表情變化,然而,視線落在他身上的瞬間,他卻無動於衷地別開頭,看窗邊的風景——妄管在外面的是一幢幢石屎高樓。

「要一起去吃飯嗎?藝術家!」同伴的聲音陪著下課的鈴聲此起彼落,喚回了他的注意,也令我稍為放心了少許。至少高中的時光,叛逆又 固執的靈魂仍有人攙扶著前往。就在我這樣想的時候,他冷漠地拍開了旁 人的手:

「別用那個名字叫喚我,放手。」

同伴的臉色帶著少許尷尬,一些難以言喻的不滿,但仍圓滿地笑笑, 隨意找個適合的理由推搪過去,然後結伴離開。只留我和他,在空曠的畫 室之中,四目交投。 敏感的他亦似乎意識到什麼,頓了頓才開口交代道:「……我沒什麼 談得來的朋友。」便抱起書具和教科書,頭也不回地離開。

我的內心,在那一刻感受到,不光是不滿和委屈,他的腦海中,充斥著孤獨和不被理解的心酸。而他卻必須擁抱著種種的包袱,竭力前往未知的道路。

藝術創作仿佛成了他唯一的心靈支柱,在現今的制度下,我身為藝術的啟蒙者,卻被逼在他的唯一出口上,打下殘忍的分數。

讓我深切意識到的是,需要和他再次仔細交談,是不久後的評賞測驗課上,他緊握著筆,在大家仍舊奮筆疾書的時刻,停下動作,然後再也沒有動靜。眼淚隨著他止住的動作,不動聲息地流落,一滴一滴,沒法遏止地自他的眼中溢出。

「孩子不是等待被填滿的瓶子,而是盼望化作燃燒的火焰。」

我想,藝術原本給予的,是芸芸學海中的一片淨土,學生擁有無拘無束的畫筆,在思緒的頂端,將心中所想,心中所念的感情傾注於畫布之上。技巧、構圖、色彩通通只是次要,最為重要的,是創作時享受的心。

那也許是對現實社會的不滿;又或是對生活所擁有的美好而滿懷感 恩;甚至單純為了記錄心愛之人那抹甜美的笑,皆能成為畫布的題材。

視覺藝術本是如此美好的學科。





而現今我所看到的,卻是被附和的要求打壓得無法喘息的靈魂、被曾 經深深熱愛的畫筆鞭灼的身軀;又猶如被喝斥將滿注彩沙的瓶子倒淨的孩 子。當你拆掉他的翅膀,卻又強逼他在困籠中飛翔,那又為何要求他能成 為燃燒的火焰,帶給你驚喜呢?

「你在想些什麼?」待終於撥出時間面談的時候,首先注意到的,是 他臉上顯而易見的黑眼圈,猶豫常註在臉上的鳥黑,一點一點,無聲地透 露著他在背後的掙扎,還有常繞在心頭的壓力。以簡約的一句話作開頭, 我期待這個頑強的孩子,或多或少將自己的心胸敞開一些,但他卻久久沒 有吐露半句。

論學業,他說:「我的成績不俗,只是數理太弱,沒法升讀大學。」;論人際,他說:「寧缺勿濫,在現實的高中生涯,無法遇到能交心的友誼亦是平常事。」;論家庭,他又說:「父母健在,有一位就讀名校的弟弟,家境尚算不俗。」我還想勸說些什麼,他卻搶先一步打算離開現場,這時,我下意識說出問句,使他的腳步因此停住。

「那你自己呢?你對自己有什麼想法?」聽罷,他一如既往地沒有吐露半句,時間卻停頓了般,使他沒法移開半步,愣然過後是無盡的寂靜,安靜得能聽清楚的步伐;又能聞見風擦過紙的沙沙作響。過後,他才以略帶顫抖的聲線,強裝鎮定地落下一句:「我不確定,這也不是科任老師的工作吧,你管太多了。」

我嘆了一口氣,雙手交疊放於桌上。然後,緩緩交代出自己一直以來 的想法。 「在我眼中,你是很出色的學生。談論你的作品,具有強烈的個人風格和對事物的感觸;而性格亦是獨特,不輕易和他人妥協。能堅持自己的主見並不是壞事,因為那將會使你成就更出眾的作品。」

他不置可否,眼睛卻定定盯著我,眉心緊皺著,似乎疑惑我想表達什麼。

「但在堅持自己主見的同時,學習一時的忍讓和包容,完成必要的要求,是我希望你能從高中生活裏學會的。」他低下頭來,猶豫聽著千篇一律的唠叨,神情透露出些許的不耐煩。因此,話鋒一轉,我喃喃道:「你最應該接受的教育並不是這些。主流教育的制度使你痛苦、你痛恨背誦、亦討厭數理——現時的教育制度限制你的翅膀,使你無法飛向嚮往之地。」

只見,難得地,他的視線再次停在我的身上。他的眉心因話語而稍微 放鬆少許,卻依舊皺着,急切地渴望從我口中得到一絲認同。

「藝術在你心中佔極大的地位,因它承載了你的所有悲傷、憤怒、還有對將來的無助、無法接納自己的未來。」我頓了頓,惋惜地繼續。「我希望你能接受,並理解現今的制度仍然有很多改善的空間,哪怕是藝術科也好,制度仍存在許多問題。那不應該由身為學生的你來承擔。但人生有時候必須接受一些不如理想的條件,咬緊牙關,衝過困境。在學生時期,我也曾經感受過這份委屈與難受,所以,我能理解自己被否定的難堪和痛苦。但請你記着——被他人否定頂多只是一點打擊,自我否定是真正意義上的放棄,那會使你失去更多、更多展現自我、展現才華的機會。」





「我認為那樣是相當可惜的,特別是當你已經開始萌生逃避的念頭。」他苦笑道。我看着他的眼簾垂下,似乎說中了心事般,躲開我的視線。

「作為老師,我欣賞你的才華和大膽,藝術工作者所需的膽大心細,你全部具有。」

「但作為成人,我為你的心結和痛苦而感到可惜,它們不應該堵塞你的道路、阻止你得到更多機會。孩子不是等待填滿的瓶子,而是渴望化作燃燒的火焰,可以將纖細的指尖和銳利的筆尖化作你的武器,一展所長,打破現有的困境——你具備所有能力,現在只差突破心魔,勇敢展現自己,在困籠的邊緣發光發熱,燃燒得足以向世人證明你的努力和才華,而不是點到即止、隨心所欲,不滿就消極以對,最終失去方向,自憐自卑。」

他聽罷,無言以對,卻不由得撥弄着尚沾有顏料的指尖,把一塊塊結 成硬塊的顏料碎屑自手心撥走。及後不自然地踢了踢椅子,才有開口意欲 說些什麼。

他最終落下一句:「……這星期的作業是什麼?」我無奈地輕笑,感 嘆年輕的孩子同時也該學會坦率,並將前天特價買的黑巧克力塞到他的手 心。「吃些巧克力能讓心情變好,你回去好好休息,別急着做到最好,那 只會增加你的壓力……下星期的題目是『暖流』,我希望你着重空間感的 變化和色彩運用、啊!主題是重點,你應該……」 四月七日,我的桌上被放置了一塊完好無缺的黑巧克力,附上便利貼一張,上頭寫道,「我的體質無法吃甜食,你自己慢慢品嚐吧。」

正想皺眉之際,你又注意到,在下面有一幅新完成的畫作,上頭有着無比熟悉的容貌,那是已經經歷了四十多年的歲月,被年華洗禮而顯得略帶倦容的女士側影,正收拾着被拆得肢解破碎的黑巧克力塊,堆砌成小房子的模樣,臉上流露柔和而慈愛的笑,整體色調在灰調中透出暖陽般的橘橙,輔和淺藍以及淺粉色的光影,畫面充滿詩意。

只見自白上簡短地記述道——致一位希望我有所成長而努力的女士, 我認為暖流,是來自肯定、鼓勵、接納和支持,然後推進成長的過程。

所謂成長,是學會接受自己,肯定自己,哪怕是全力踏出一小步,也 是種成長。許多人因為無法突破自己的心魔、又或是被現實的洪流打擊, 從狹窄的瓶中,被棄置於更狹小的井內,困苦地掙扎。但又有人勇敢地打 破瓶子,在水花之中燃燒,使自己能在井中突圍而出。一切都取決於個人 的心態、努力和改變。

但願在懷有赤子之心的同時,他能突破瓶口,使自己化作燃燒的火焰,成就更出眾的自我,得以成長。

傳統是創新的包袱?

時人有言:「傳統是創新的包袱,室礙後人推陳出新。」誠然,社會 普遍或會認為傳統如創新的絆腳石,堵塞通往創新的康莊大道。然而,傳 統的石頭是絆腳石還是踏腳石,全視乎我們如何看待。既然有一塊石頭在 跟前,何不好好利用它,使傳統成為創新的助力呢?

萬事起頭難,以中國人大躍進時期為例,全民大煉鋼,最終卻只煉成一堆廢鐵,令民不聊生,這正正是因為他們缺乏前人的經驗,盲目以土法煉鋼,自以為創新,反倒失敗收場。可見,創新必須有傳統作為基礎再加以發展,才能夠減低失敗的風險,邁向成功。比如錢穆、唐君毅先生的新儒學思想,都是以傳統的儒、道、釋三家思想為基礎,加入自己嶄新的見解並融會貫通,方能提出受世人認同的新儒學思想。外國著名科學家愛迪生亦如是,他購入了約瑟夫失敗的燈泡的專利,以此作為基礎,以錦線代替碳線,結果令鎢綠燈泡一舉成名,流芳百世,更為後代在黑暗中帶來光明。若非約瑟夫的失敗燈泡為基礎,愛迪生的名字就未必為人所知,成為家喻戶曉的偉人了。

當然有人會反駁創新亦可以是無中生有,忽發奇想而成的。但這「奇想」可是以傳統作為靈感泉源呢!中國著名國畫大師齊白石曾告誠他的弟子「學我者生,似我者死」,意指弟子許麟廬應學習齊白石畫中的神韻和技法,從而啟發自己的創意,創造出獨一無二,別樹一幟的風格。香港中學文憑試的視覺藝術科考試亦要求考生先就前人的藝術作品做賞析,從中汲取啟發再作畫一幅就是延續這精神。此外,相信大家都知道中國書法家王羲之的故事,他泛覽博識,參考秦漢的書法名家作品,從而啟發他創作出一種前所未有,別具個人風格的書法字體。可見無論古今,時人皆以傳統作為靈感泉源,啟發個人思考,激發創新靈感的思維。

人無完人,傳統也不會是絕對正面,對社會有所裨益,但這些迂腐敗壞的傳統可以作為反面教材,警惕後世切勿重蹈覆轍,並要創新革除傳統的弊病,造福社會。正如周朝所行的封建制度,使得群雄割據,相互間為吞併挑起連年戰火,生靈塗炭,百姓苦不堪言。後人正正借古鑒今,取其利棄其弊,以郡縣制管理地大物博的國土,防止地方集權過大又可有效治理各省各縣,達致長治久安。由此可見,即使是滿有流弊的傳統,對創新亦有反思及警惕作用。

一寸光陰一寸金,由零開始創新往往需要花費許多時間。然而,有了傳統便可以節省創新的時間。美國著名智能手機公司蘋果的產品風行全球,他們是參考前人的成果而製作,既有的手機通話功能,再加上自行鑽研並加入指模解鎖,視訊通話等創新科技。由於毋須把起步點設於研發即時通訊的技術,大大節省研發的時間,加快創新的速度,否則通訊的發展也不會如現今般一日千里,所以傳統又怎會是創新的包袱呢?

儘管傳統的一些便捷會築成一個令人襄足不前的安舒區,但這並不代表要故步自封,畫地為牢,反之我們應該好好善用傳統,而非任讓傳統成為我們所謂的「包袱」。從上述云云事例及傳統的益處可以知道,傳統絕對不是我們創新的包袱,反而給予我們機會打破框框,不主故常,促進創新。

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承繼與創新

李小龍作為一個國際著名華人武術家,以其對武術的了解發展出一套新穎的武道哲學——截拳道,「以無限為有限,以無法為有法」是李小龍的截拳道哲學理念,他的創新精神顛覆當時專以套路為主的中國傳統武術環境,有極為重要的價值與意義。但是若他沒有以詠春拳、拳擊、擊劍為基礎,再輔以跆拳道、柔道、角力、法國腿擊術等等各國文化,取其優點並融會後,他也不會成功。甚至可以斷言,若沒有繼承過往的武術,並加以篩選,將優良的保留,將沒用的拋棄,截拳道也不會被創造出來。由此可見,只有在繼承之中去蕪存菁,才能創新成功。

創新亦不是一步登天的事情,而是一個進程,是由繼承演變出來。發明是創新的其中一種,從繼承開始,是由無數前人的心血結晶墊在腳下,去觸及成功,才稱得上為發明。電燈泡是由愛油生發明,愛迪生做了近二千次耐熱材料及超過六百多種植物纖維的實驗才艱辛地製造出一個現代式的燈泡,可是又有誰記得愛迪生創造燈泡所運用的知識是從何處得到?只需回想起,如果沒有眾多學者前仆後繼以自身所學去研究電,那麼愛迪生想要發明出電燈泡可謂天方夜譚。愛迪生繼承了歷代人不斷完善的知識,那可是由無數科學家經過年月之間的沉殿,疊加與醞釀才發展成被書本所記錄著的知識,亦是一種精神,去探索新事物的一個欲望。不難看到繼承與創新的關係的確密不可分。

有人說:「在繼承大部分舊有的想法,而只改變一小部分,只能算為 抄襲。」我卻不太認同,首先想法並不是獨有的,所以不存在什麼抄襲, 好的想法就不應被壟斷,好的想法是讓別人參考再加以創新,越是優秀的 作品和思路,就越會被別人學習和模仿的,這樣才能達至創新。

總結而言,繼承和創新的本質本來就一樣,繼承是將前人的創新,供 後人接受及理解,再加以利用,便成了創新。繼承和創新就是魚和水的關係,魚失去了水並不能生存下去,水失去了魚缺了點綴,兩者之間可謂相 輔相承。



I am no exception to using social media as one of my main ways to communicate with friends and distant relatives. As a regular user of social media, I post photos and comments like any young teenagers would do.

I have experienced the dilemma, which was mentioned in Carrie James' book, entitled "Disconnected: Youth, New Media and the Ethics Gap". A classmate of mine has once taken a picture of me without my consent. It may not have seemed like a big deal, but I never found out what she has done to it. This incident really bothered me and I couldn't help but wondered what the purpose for doing something that pointless was. In Carrie James' book, she points out the three ways of thinking that young people use to perform their online activities. The first is self-focused thinking, only concerning about the consequences of oneself. The second is moral thinking, concerning about the consequences of those you know. The last is ethical thinking, concerning about those you don't know and generally larger communities. From my personal experience, I don't think most young people would think about the moral or ethical concerns of what their online activities could cause. Their negligence has led to the constantly growing gap between how young people understand ethics in real life and online.

Besides my personal experience, there are other incidents when people would often neglect the ethical consequences they may cause. For example, a British man named Leigh Van Bryan was arrested and denied entry to the U.S. on arrival. The reason was because of the tweets he had sent on Twitter, stating how he and his friend were going to "destroy America" and "dig up Marilyn Monroe". They were obviously joking, but it was no joke to local authorities.

It may seem overboard, but it was a must to do. This particular incident shows one of the major consequences to what would happen when we act recklessly on social media. Nowadays, whenever these types of posts appear and face hostile criticisms, people would just say that it was "just a joke" and believe that the misunderstanding would be cleared. However, that is not the case. According to Carrie James' book, when faced with such dilemmas, people often emphasise their personal safety over online ethics. But because they choose to ignore their online ethics, it costs their safety in real life as well. I believe most people, especially young people, have not taken the issue of privacy, property and participation online seriously.

To reflect on this, ethical thinking is very important when it comes to using social media. The digital ethics gap shows the direct and indirect effects of our online actions may have on the internet and in real life. The way we think affects the way we act and there will always be consequences that we have to bear for ourselves.

To take the case of a charged game, Minecraft, I intentionally want to help my friend to save some money when agreeing to offer my google account to her. It was when I found that she had messaged my cousin privately had I realized I had unknowingly shared my personal information under the setting of sync. The affected area may be immeasurable, as my personal safety and privacy will be in hazard.

In retrospect, that was clearly a fatal moral and ethical blind spot as described in *Disconnected*. Morally, I lack the fore sensitivity of making a moral decision and of being aware of the potential consequences of sacrificing privacy. I prioritized saving money and co-playing to keeping others' privacy, which is inconsiderate and ethically faulty. Sharing contacts with people is based on mutual trust and on the basis of safeguarding others' privacy. Sharing the contacts without others' permission is betrayal of this trust. People in my contact list may receive unnecessary spam messages, possibly getting into trouble because of me indirectly.

The case ended short, right after I sent apologies to every single person for their forgiveness, and that was when I started wondering the possible "disconnects" for me and my peer generation with the moral and ethical consideration.

Ethically, as a player, the act of "sharing account" will harm the developers, the gaming industry and even other gamers. The game is created by many

developers and that the fee charged is a return for each of their persistence. Game users have the responsibility to report pirates and not to use them so that the size of gaming market can be maintained. Clearly, from the moment I chose to "share" my account, that has already been an irresponsible act that corrodes the game developer's work and the game's value.

We would be easily alerted when requested to provide our basic information like addresses or names in real life, but fail to do the same when this happens online. The question of whether there are double standards between the real and the virtual world arises. When we are considering a gym membership card, we know that there are real identity verification and limited physical resources, so that we would choose not to share the membership with others. Yet, in the virtual world, with the seemingly "lower security" and the lack of ways in identifying who is who, we come to believe the "unlimited" resources are free to share. However, this is just a deception provided by the internet. Sharing different accounts under the same google account is still utilizing scarce resources, another kind of exploitation of others.

Young people know that the virtual world is new, and we come to trust this new way of communication and enlarging social circles, that comes with new ways in handling our information. As information flow is so fast and huge, we achieve what we need too easily, and even with the noble intention of internet to share, we need to reconsider the ethical consequences of our online behaviour.

Book Review on War Storm by Victoria Aveyard

It is a fiction, Victoria Aveyard's *War Storm* in her *Red Queen Series*, set in a fantasy world called Norta with clans divided by blood colours.

The female heroine is called Mare Barrow, a red-blood rebel gifted with silver blood magical abilities. This finale is about the one she loves, Calore, chose the crown in the price of her. After numerous betrayals and struggles against the Silver Royalties, she would have to choose her fate to be the new caged Queen of the country that has been suppressing her own clan, or to overthrow the Silvers.

In the setting of a world of careers and community participation merely determined by class, people conform to the inequality stemmed from colours. Silvers can be merchants and nobles; while Reds workers, soldiers and slaves. Under the absolutism of monarchs, Mare is the pioneer to make a change. I had never spotted any problems about free downloading music online, neither my parents nor friends - nor even lots of netizens, I now suspect. Not until one day when I started to research about a Korean soloist I had adored, clicking on the button "how to support an artist", had I finally realised what I had done in the past was called "illegal downloading" and that the song's artists and producers could not get paid because I ripped them off. That's the moment I also found out I could simply pay fifty dollars to music apps like Apple Music

or Spotify to listen to music legally, which is an affordable sum to support the artists or producers by complying with copyright.

In the past, due to my lack of financial resources and misunderstanding on illegal downloads, I only thought of the easiest and most convenient way to benefit myself, blindly following what people around me have done as "everybody does it" without really considering the ethical consequences of my action. This is a totally selfish act as I might affect tons of people's living. Sadly, the majority of netizens falls into this ethical blind spot, some even do so deliberately because most piracy websites provide easier access and are free of charge. I am glad that at least I noticed my misdeed and have tried to rectify it by avoiding using the wrong way. I do feel apologetic for what I have done and hope that more and more teenagers do realise it and stop those actions by realizing the moral and ethical obligations of our online behaviour.

Book review: All the Bright Places by Jennifer Niven

I'd choose Jennifer Niven's *All the bright places*. The story begins when Finch and Violet met each other at the school's bell tower wanting to plunge into death. Fortunately, Finch has convinced Violet to go back to class together. 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Overseas Studies

Would you like to study overseas? Do you think studying overseas can improve your learning? In this article, I will give two reasons for the phenomenon of Hong Kong parents sending their children to other countries to complete their schooling.

The first reason for this phenomenon is that parents do not identify with the education system in Hong Kong. The Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination (HKDSE) was adopted in 2012. This examination has attached importance to students' future studies since their grades will decide whether they are eligible for a university place. Therefore, all schools keep giving exam practice papers to students to drill their exam skills. Some parents think this is not good for their children. For example, they may get sick and they have to look after themselves. Another example is that they may not get along with the local students. In that case, they should learn to manage their emotions and solve this problem. So, giving their children the opportunity to learn independence and problem-solving skills is another reason for Hong Kong parents sending their children to study abroad.

Regarding the impacts of this phenomenon, there is a positive impact on the children who leave to study overseas – their motivation of study can be increased. The education method overseas is different from that of Hong Kong. Their main education principle is to help students develop creative thinking. The schools overseas give more freedom to students than Hong Kong. They do not assign lots of homework or tests. The education system there can help students to learn in a more effective way than in Hong Kong.

However, this phenomenon may bring an undesirable impact on the local schools in Hong Kong – the number of students will decrease. Based on the data from the Hong Kong Government, the birth rate is not high and is decreasing every year. Each woman gives birth to only 1.2 babies on average, so we can see that the birth rate is quite low. If more and more local students study overseas, the number of students will decrease further.

In conclusion, there are two reasons of why parents in Hong Kong are sending their children to other countries to complete their schooling. However, there are impacts on local schools and the children who leave to study overseas. Whether parents should send their children overseas to study should be decided carefully, after thorough discussions between parents and children.





Print books are better than e-books



Letter to Editor - Overcrowded Hospitals

Dear Editor,

I am Chris Wong and I am going to respond to your article about the overcrowded and understaffed hospitals in Hong Kong. I have some views over this matter and would like to suggest ways to solve the problem.

First, I agree that the Hong Kong hospitals are understaffed, especially during the flu season. For example, each nurse must take care of at least 10 patients on average. Therefore, the public hospitals should increase the medical personnel to meet the one to six international ratios. It is not easy, however, to recruit enough staff to work in public hospitals because the working conditions there are tough, and the workload is heavy. Because of this, the hospitals are persistently understaffed.

To help alleviate the understaff problem as well as the overcrowding problem in hospitals during flu season, the government may provide more free vaccines for people to reduce their chance of infecting influenza. To attract more medical personnel to work in public hospitals, the government may increase their salary. Many of the medical staff choose to work in private hospitals because of the high pay compared to that of public hospitals. If they can get higher pay in public hospitals, they may choose to work there instead.

Moreover, the government may offer subsidies to the elderly to get medical treatment in private hospitals instead of public ones. The bed occupancy rates in most public hospitals are more than 100 percent but many patients are still queuing for treatments in public hospitals. If more people get subsidies and seek medical consultation in private hospitals, the overcrowding and understaffing problems in public hospitals can be alleviated.





Finally, the government may provide more medical courses for school leavers to train up more medical personnel for future.

In conclusion, I believe that the ways mentioned above may help to relieve some tension in public hospitals. The government should keep working out feasible ways to deal with the overcrowding and understaffing problems in the long term.


