在閱讀過程裡,我們總會遇到「言有盡而意無窮」的時候,王 國維在《人間詞話》又謂:「有我之境,以我觀物,故物皆著我之色 彩。」閱讀是一個自由的國度,使人在沒有對與錯的天空下,自由自 在地在文字間遨遊,讓自己成為文章的主人。若要辛辛苦苦去猜度文 中寄意,那倒不如把感受加上屬於自己的色彩。無論是傷心的灰黑、燦爛的鮮黃或是舒坦的碧綠,文字印刷在雪白的紙張上,就是靜待著你為他們添上顏色。

二零一五年,是希望的一年。我能夠見證著這道橋的築成,也看到它一天比一天穩固,實是倍感欣喜。同學們要繼續保守你的心,用 純淨的眼睛閱讀世界,才能寫出好的文章,再用心把你們持守的這張 白紙活出美麗耀目的色彩吧!

試評論這種做法。

村 據香港大學於二零一三年有關《煙害統計》的報告顯示,因吸煙而導致死亡的人每年約有七千名。可見,吸煙不但危害市民的健康,更會引致死亡,正因吸煙的問題嚴重,有些外國政府為了解決這個問題,遂以現金獎勵成功戒煙的市民,希望能藉此減低煙民的數目。對於這種做法,我並不支持。我認為這只是飲鴆止渴、治標不治本的做法。

第一,如以現金獎勵成功戒煙的市民來解決問題,政府難於監察實況。煙民的數字龐大,政府不能知道煙民是否成功戒煙。如果政府派員監察,便需要大量人手,耗費大量公帑。例如很多市民會在沒有警察監視時,不遵守交通規矩,在紅燈亮時過馬路。煙民也有可能像市民紅燈過馬路的情況一樣混水摸魚,令政府難於監察。

第二,戒煙的定義也很模糊。如果停止吸煙一個月是否也能得到 獎金?然後又可再次吸煙呢?就像一個變了心的丈夫,被發現有第三 者時就與她斷絕關係,但下一次又會再另結新歡,欲斷難斷,藕斷絲 連,最終離婚。相信心癮大的煙民亦一樣,最終也無法成功戒煙,難 以解決問題。

雖然很多人都認為以現金獎勵成功戒煙的市民不能徹底解決問題,但仍有人支持這種做法。可是,我卻認為這政策可謂「未見其利,先見其害」。

首先,這種做法有可能會吸引沒有吸煙習慣的煙民加入吸煙行列。因為有些市民可能會為了得到那些獎金而嘗試吸煙,藉此領取獎金。因此,這樣根本無助解決問題,只會令問題更嚴重。

其次,這做法不僅會造成社會分化,更會造成政府龐大的財政負擔。實質上,社會上太多人染上不良的嗜好,除了吸煙,還有賭博、酗酒等,他們會覺得既然成功戒煙的煙民有獎金,那麼如果他們能成功戒掉不良嗜好,他們理應也得到獎金。發展下去,最終,只會引來大量市民向政府索取獎金,造成社會分化,同時也為政府帶來龐大的財政負擔。

雖然我欣賞政府為市民健康而投放資源,但客觀而論,以現金來獎勵成功戒煙的市民並不是最有效、最可行的方法。因此,政府在制訂措施時應三思而行,或另謀可行的對策,而且市民已是成年人,亦應對自己的行為負責。





More incinerators should be built in Hong Kong

The three landfills will be saturated by next year, 2015. The government needs to find another way to treat the rubbish which is sent to the landfills. One of the ways is to build incinerators. However, some people feel that this causes many problems. In this essay, I will discuss the arguments for and against the building of incinerators.

One argument in favour of building incinerators is that using them to burn rubbish can reduce the original size of the rubbish by about 10%. In addition, this can relieve pressure on the landfills because we all know that the landfills will be saturated in 2015. Building incinerators can help us solve the problem.

Another important argument is that we can collect the heat when burning rubbish using incinerators and generate electricity for Hong Kong citizens. What is more, the Hong Kong government can follow what the Taiwanese government is doing with the heat produced by incinerators. They make use of the heat to warm up the water in the swimming pools nearby. This can kill two birds with one stone.

We can see that there are advantages to using incinerators to burn rubbish, both for the landfills and for Hong Kong citizens. On the other hand, there are also some disadvantages.

The first disadvantage is that burning rubbish is not environmentally friendly. Burning rubbish releases a large amount of carbon dioxide. This increases the problem of global warming. T he government is planning to build more incinerators in Hong Kong now. However, some people think that it is not good to build incinerators. In this essay, I will discuss the arguments for and against the use of incinerators.

One argument in favour of building incinerators is that they can change waste into electricity. The electricity generated by incinerators can supply nearly 100,000 households. It can also be used to supply heated swimming pools. In addition, it can reduce 440,000 tonnes of carbon dioxide emissions.

Another important argument is that building incinerators is necessary. According to the information provided by the government, our waste has far exceeded the amount that the government had expected. They at first estimated that the daily volume of waste disposed of in the landfills was 12,500 tonnes in 1989, and in 2001, increased to 16,700 tonnes of waste. However, if the situation continues, the landfills will be saturated by 2015, rather than the originally expected 2020. Incinerators can help reduce a huge amount of garbage and thus ease the need of expanding landfills.

We can see that there are advantages to using incinerators. On the other hand, there are also some disadvantages.

The first disadvantage is that incinerators are expensive to run. An incinerator costs about HK\$353 million a year to run. Moreover, incinerators require regular maintenance. As the environmental regulations are becoming stricter and stricter, we need to invest in more pollution abatement equipment and more frequent monitoring of stack gas and waste water emissions.

Another problem with using incinerators is that it releases toxic substances. When we use incinerators to burn waste, it produces dioxin, which is a carcinogenic substance. If we absorb too much dioxin in daily life, we will suffer from many kinds of diseases such as heart diseases, reproductive and developmental problems.

The means test for the proposed new HK\$2,200-a-month old-age subsidy is necessary.

Besides, there would be many side effects if the means test was scrapped.


It is estimated that, if it was waived, the cost of the scheme would soar from HK\$6 billion to HK\$10 billion. This HK\$4 billion difference could be better spent on infrastructure projects or improving our medical services.

Some may argue that HK\$10 billion is not a big deal for an administration with a large surplus, but the economy has gone through difficult periods recently and we could be facing a financial crisis in the future. The government will need substantial funds to deal with that.

Also, the government needs to address the problem of an ageing population and estimate the financial burden of the social welfare system. We will need tight controls on future expenditure or government reserves will dry up. Its government neglected the consequences of providing a costly social welfare system and this hurts the national economy.

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Although I think the means test is an essential part of the new oldage subsidy, the government must ensure that it has deployed sufficient staff to deal with it and that the instructions are clear and straightforward for elderly people.

 ${\bf A}$ s a member of Hong Kong's ethnic minorities, I face a lot of problems in my daily life.

In education, it is hard for me to study in an ordinary Chinese school. I cannot catch up with the lessons because I am unable to speak and write as other Chinese students. It gives me a lot of pressure. My school results are usually bad. I feel very frustrated and lose motivation. Since I am a minority at school, I do not have any friends. I feel lonely and I have no friends to share my feelings with.

In my daily life, I get discriminated by local Hong Kong people. When I get on a bus, they usually choose not to sit beside me. Even if they sit beside me, they always stare at me and try to keep a distance from me. These make me very embarrassed.

For career path, I do not have too much hope. Most of my relatives, including my parents, are doing low-level jobs with low salaries in Hong Kong such as security guards, construction workers and dishwashers in restaurants. Employers prefer hiring local people instead of minorities if they have a choice.

In fact, the Hong Kong Government has no rules and regulations to protect or support the minorities in Hong Kong. The choices of schools for minorities are very limited. Most of us have to study in local schools which are usually difficult for us to cope with. There is no formal organization in Hong Kong where minorities can get help from if they face any problem.

To conclude, I want the Hong Kong Government to set up rules and regulations to help the minorities in Hong Kong. We need schools that can accommodate minorities. We need a formal organization that minorities can get help from and understands our needs. The Hong Kong Government should do more promotion to encourage local people to accept us so that we will not get discriminated from school or from work. Minorities do a lot of contribution in Hong Kong and I believe minorities need this protection.

Life is not always flawless. After I graduated from secondary school, everything in my life has changed.

Even when I was luckily being hired, colleagues did not mingle with me much. To them, I am different. I am an outsider.



Can anyone help us, the ethnic minorities, to fight for our rights? Do riots or demonstrations help? Those discrimination concepts are imprinted in those stubborn Hongkongers' minds. I strongly believe that it was the duty of the Hong Kong government to educate the public and to set up policies to protect our rights.

Firstly, the Hong Kong government should allocate more budget on educating the young generation to accept us like part of their family members. They should not steer away from us but to communicate with us. They should be taught a harmonious

society is an inclusion of people from different nations and backgrounds. There could be more celebrations of our festivals, like Diwali. Though it was not made a public holiday, can the employers respect our culture by giving us a discretionary holiday? oncern has been expressed by many people about the rapid increase in the number of mainland visitors coming into Hong Kong, since the introduction of visas allowing independent travelers from across the border.



Figures show that last year mainland visitors comprised the largest visitor source market, with 28.1 million arrivals, accounting for 67 per cent of all arrivals.

In terms of visitors, Hong Kong has reached capacity and cannot cope with any more people coming in through any proposed extension of multiple-entry visitor permits.



But the most important point is that we cannot satisfy human wants even though we build a lot of windmills. The more windmills and energy stations we build, the more energy we use. Besides, it will only make the globe worse.

Finally, I am going to explain a point that no one has noticed or discussed before – noise pollution. The residents in wind farms in England have been annoyed by the noise pollution produced by the windmills. They cannot sleep at night because of the noise. Therefore, we cannot build windmills near residential areas.

In conclusion, I strongly disagree that it is good for Hong Kong to use wind energy for its electricity supply because it has a great negative impact on Hong Kong people.

In conclusion, we believe that Hong Kong is not suitable for using solar energy because it is unreliable and expensive.

Both the first speaker and the second speaker from the negative team have tried to tell us that solar energy needs expensive equipment. Besides that, the sun, the source of solar energy, never shines for 24 hours either. Those things may be true but we can use solar energy for the whole day, because there is a method which uses solar energy to heat the salt during the daytime. Then, use the energy in the salt to give energy supply at nighttime. Also, people who live in a flourishing city have enough money to spend or even there is money left. Thus, the government can receive more money by taxation to build the expensive equipment.

Furthermore, our first speaker has already explained that solar energy is eco-friendly since it is renewable energy. Also, it is better than other fuels. Our second speaker has also argued that solar energy saves their dollars, because it can have a far-reaching development both in the economy and energy supply. She mentioned it can definitely slow down global warming too.

It is good to use nuclear energy for Hong Kong's electricity supply



Just now, the second speaker of the opposition team has said that there is not enough land here in Hong Kong to build a large nuclear power plant. However, we reclam land to solve this problem. Reclamation can increase the supply of land in Hong Kong. Besides that, the second speaker of the opposition team has also said that there is not enough money for the government to invest in this project. For this argument, we believe that the big companies in Hong Kong such as Cheung Kong Holdings, started by Sir Lee Ka Shing, can help. They can give out some money to assist the government to invest in this project. We believe that Hong Kong citizens are responsible. It is their duty and this can help us to find other new energy sources.

In conclusion, our team strongly believes that it is good for Hong Kong to use nuclear power to generate electricity.




No excuse for protest violence

The central government has only had success with short-term measures that are implemented in advance of a major event such as the Beijing Olympics or the Apec summit.



I'm sorry to hear about your three problems. They are very difficult problems, but I hope I can help you with my advice.



5.2 Promotion

It is believed that advertising the events on TV will be an effective way to promote the festival. Therefore, people in other countries around the world will get to know the festival.
