名人談讀

余光中

開卷如開芝麻門》

讀書其實只是交友的延長。我們交友,只能以 時人為對象,而目朋友的數量畢竟有限。但是 靠了書籍,我們可以廣交異時和異地的朋友; 要説擇友,那就更自由了。一個人的經驗當然 以親身得來的最為真切可靠,可是直接的經驗 畢竟有限。讀書,正是吸收間接的經驗。生活 至上論者説讀書是逃避現實,其實讀書是擴大 現實,擴大我們的精神世界。就算是我們的親 身經驗,也不妨多聽聽別人對相似的經驗有什 麼看法,以資印證。相反地,我認為不讀書的 人才逃避現實,因為他只生活在一種空間。英 國文豪約翰生説:「寫作的唯一目的,是幫助 讀者更能享受或忍受人生。」倒過來説,讀書 的目的也在加強對人生的享受,如果你得意; 或是對人生的忍受,你如果失意。



大家必定曾經閱讀過朱自清的散文《背影》,文中敘 述了朱自清父親在送他上火車前,悉心照料他並替他 買橘子的情景,刻畫了父親對兒子的愛;但現實是父

子兩人關係十分惡劣。朱自清從小被父親嚴厲責罵,父親更曾強行 搶走他一個月的薪金。直到中年時,朱自清才決定放下對父親的仇 恨,並寫下《背影》。

朱鴻鈞(朱自清的父親)思想傳統,不願接受新式教育。因此,朱自清 自小被要求學習文言文。由於父親對自己十分嚴厲,成績稍有退步 都會被狠狠責罵,所以他自小就很怕父親,童年一直生活在戰戰兢 兢的環境裏。慶幸的是,朱自清18歲時成功考入了北京大學,光宗 耀祖。

後來由於朱自清祖母被父親活活氣死,朱自清對父親的仇恨更深。自 入讀大學後,他就甚少跟父親聯絡。

父子兩人多年沒有來往,這段時間大家都反思了自己的過錯,因 此,兩人對彼此的怨恨都減淡了。1925年,父親朱鴻鈞身體開始 出現不少毛病。那時候,他希望在人生最後的歲月可跟朱自清的關 係變好,於是放下自尊寫了一封家書給朱自清,希望能得到兒子原 諒。父子兩人的關係因此而破冰,放下仇恨。其後朱自清更將當年 與父親在火車站的情景,寫下了散文《背影》,刻畫了父親對自己 的愛。




I often heard some students nagging at me that they don't want to do homework. 'Miss Chan, please don't give us any homework!' What if

there is a class that has no final exam, no assignment, no book, and no grade required, will you attend the class? Welcome to join this special class by reading the book Tuesday with Morrie written by Mitch Albom. This book is based on his true story with his favourite professor, Morrie Schwartz. Morrie was diagnosed with a special disease ALS. Knowing his favourite professor was dying, Mitch visited Morrie every Tuesday and this turned into one final "class": lessons in how to live. There are a total of 12 lessons with various topics related to different aspects of life such as love, ageing, family, work, emotions, and, finally, death.

In this book, there are many inspirational lessons and quotes. One lesson that struck me the most is the lesson related to emotion. Morrie, a person that needed to face fear and pain from a deadly illness, advised us that we should acknowledge and express our emotions. If we hold on to them, we can never get to the state of being detached. But by throwing ourselves into these emotions, by allowing ourselves to dive in, all the way, over our head, we then experience the emotions fully and completely. Eventually, we will get rid of them.

We might have come across downs in our lives, and it's really okay to be sad. But you have to make sure you recognise it and let all your emotions out. Then you will be able to detach from it and you won't hold on to the feeling forever. In my opinion, it can be an effective way to conquer your fear and negative feelings.

If you want to know more about this special class or what other lessons are, you may read the book and perhaps you will gain some insight from it. Thank you.
